Minutes of the 70th Annual General Meeting

The 70th Annual General Meeting of Rajapur Saraswat Sangh, Mumbai, was held on September 19, 2020, at 10.00 a.m. at Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Mandal, Siddhivinayak Nagar, Bhopar Road (Off. Manpada Road), Dombivli (East) - 421 204. The meeting was presided over by Mr. Prabhakar D Borkar, the President of the Sangh. 93 members were present in the meeting. As there was no quorum at the scheduled time i.e 10.00 a.m., the meeting had to be adjourned and the adjourned meeting was started at 10.30 a.m. as per the notice dated 21.08.2021, circulated amongst the members.

After the prayer (**Agenda No. 01**) by the Mahila Mandal members, Ms. Pooja J Kamath, Hon. Secretary, welcomed the president, office bearers, members and guests present at the meeting and requested the President Mr. P D Borkar and all the office bearers to occupy the seats on dais. Ms. Pooja J Kamath also requested Mr. M. P. Naik, Vice-President of Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Mandal to be present on dais on behalf of Mandal. She read the notice dated 21.08.2021, circulated amongst the members and notice of the meeting published in the daily newspaper - Sunday Business Standard, issue dated August 30, 2021, for the information of the members present and briefed about the agenda of the meeting.

The following matters were transacted in the meeting:

Condolence (Agenda No. 02): President informed that during the last one and half years, many samaj members including Sangh's members have passed away due to different reasons including Covid-19 pandemic. Mr. P D Borkar, President, spoke about the contributions made by late Shri Ramachandra K Naik (Mulund), late Smt. Nirupama R. Shevde Vikhroli & late Smt. Lakshmi Prabhu (Dahisar) to the Sangh specifically and Samaj in general. The gathering paid its tributes to the deceased members. The gathering also paid its tributes to the founder members of the Sangh & Mahila Mandal who have passed away.

As a token of respect to the departed souls, two minutes silence was observed, and the following resolution was passed and adopted unanimously:

Resolution No: 01/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the Rajapur Saraswat Sangh, Mumbai, deeply mourns the sad demise of its members who passed away during the year and pray for the Sadgati of the departed souls and further prays the Almighty to give strength and courage to bear this irreparable loss caused to the family members of the deceased."

Agenda No. 3: To condone the delay in holding the AGM as the same could not be convened & conducted in time as per statutory requirement due to Covic-19 pandemic and lock-down situations - President, Mr. P D Borkar, informed that the Annual General Meeting for the year 2019-2020 could not be convened & conducted in time (i.e. on or before September 30, 2020) as per statutory requirement due to Covic-19 pandemic and lock-down situations. He requested the members to condone the delay and pass a resolution in this regard. Accordingly, after discussions, Mr. Sanjay Patkar (Mulund) proposed that the delay in holding the Annual General Meeting for the year 2019-2020 be condoned as the situation was beyond the control of the Sangh and the same was seconded by Mr. Diwakar D Naik (Chembur). The following resolution was passed:

Resolution No: 02/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the delay in holding the Annual General Meeting for the year 2019-2020 be and is hereby condoned unanimously after the same was proposed by Mr. Sanjay Patkar (Mulund) & seconded by Mr. Diwakar D Naik (Chembur)."

Agenda No. 4: To read and confirm the minutes of the last AGM, held on September 29, 2019:

The Hon. Secretary, Ms. Pooja J Kamath, read the minutes of the 69th Annual General Meeting, held on September 29, 2019, and the same was approved unanimously after it was proposed by Mr. Vishwanath Nayak (Andheri) & seconded by Mr. Vittal D. Naik (Dombivli)."

Resolution No: 03/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the minutes of the last annual general meeting, held on September 29, 2019, be and is hereby read, approved and adopted unanimously after it was proposed by proposed by Mr. Vishwanath Nayak (Andheri) & seconded by Mr. Vittal D. Naik (Dombivli)."

Agenda No. 5: Presentation and approval of Annual Report & Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended March 31, 2020

Annual Report:

Hon. Secretary, Ms. Pooja J Kamath, placed "the annual report" of the Sangh for the year ended March 31, 2020, before the Annual General Meeting for its approval. She said that Annual Report includes the report of Mahila Mandal and Yuva Vrinda.

The Annual Report, was approved unanimously and the following resolution was passed and adopted after the same was proposed by Mr. Keshav Borkar (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Harischandra Kamath (Santacruz) and the following resolution was passed:

Resolution No: 04/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the annual report for the year ended March 31, 2020 be and is hereby read, approved and adopted unanimously after the same was proposed by Mr. Keshav Borkar (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Harischandra Kamath (Santacruz)".

Statement of Accounts:

The Hon Treasurer, Mr. Anil P Nayak, placed before the meeting the audited statement of accounts for the year ended 31st March 2020.

President Mr. Borkar drew the attention of members present to the item "Roots & Branches DVDs" of Schedule B of Balance Sheet amounting to Rs. 2,800/-. President said that these DVDs have become old & unusable and said that same may not be sold in future due to technological changes in the computers. He requested the members to write off this item and pass a suitable resolution. After discussions it was decided that item "Roots & Branches DVDs" of Schedule B of Balance Sheet amounting to Rs. 2800/- be written off and the following resolution was passed:

Resolution No: 05/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the item "Roots & Branches DVDs" of Schedule B of Balance Sheet amounting to Rs. 2800/- be and is hereby written off after the same was proposed by Mr. Raghunath Prabhu (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Keshav Borkar (Dombivli)."

Mr. Ravindra Nayak (Dombivli) asked the reason for not publishing the Auditor's Report in the Annual Report for which President replied that it was due to oversight and remained unpublished. The Auditor's Report was read for the information of the members.

As there were no other clarifications sought from anyone, audited statement of accounts for the year ended 31st March 2020, was approved unanimously after the same was proposed by Mr Ravindra Nayak (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Raghavendra L Nayak (Kalyan).

Resolution No: 06/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended March 31, 2020 be and are hereby approved and adopted unanimously after the same was proposed by Mr. Ravindra Nayak (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Raghavendra L Nayak (Kalyan)."

Agenda No. 6: Presentation and Approval of Budget for the year 2020 - 2021:

Hon Secretary, Ms. Pooja J Kamath, presented the budget for the year 2020–2021, a copy of which had already been submitted to the office of the Charity Commissioner as per statutory requirement on February 28, 2020.

After discussion the General Body authorised the Executive Committee to:

- Spend towards urgent/major repairs of the building premises;
- Spend towards any minor repairs to the office premises and up-keep of the building;
- Spend towards donations in deserving/emergency cases for social, religious and cultural activities;
- Spend towards the objects of the Sangh; &
- Spend towards expenses required in respect of matters related to redevelopment/reconstruction of the land/property of the Sangh.

The budget for the year 2020-2021 was unanimously approved after the same was proposed by Mr. Ashok Patkar (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Vishwanath N Nayak (Andheri).

Resolution No: 07/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT the Budget for the year 2020-2021 be and is hereby approved and adopted unanimously after the same was proposed by proposed by Mr. Ashok Patkar (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Vishwanath N Nayak (Andheri)" and further it was also Resolved that the Executive Committee be and is hereby authorized to spend towards urgent/major repairs/renovation, repairs to the office premises and up-keep of the building, donations in deserving /emergency cases for social, religious and cultural activities, towards object of the Sangh & towards expenses required in respect of matters related to redevelopment/reconstruction of the land/property of the Sangh."

Agenda No. 6: Appointment of Internal Auditors for the year 2020-2021:

Mr. P D Borkar said that Mr. Ravindra N Kamath (Kandivli) had conducted and completed the Internal Audit work for the last year and further said that his name may be considered for Internal Audit for the year 2020-2021 if no other names are proposed. As no other names were proposed and seconded in the meeting for the Internal Auditor/s for the year 2020-2021, it was unanimously decided to appoint Mr. Ravindra N Kamath (Kandivli) as Internal Auditor for the year 2020-2021 after the same was proposed by Mr. Ramesh U Kamath (Chembur) & seconded by Mr. Raghunath N Naik (Dombivli) and the following resolution was passed and adopted:

Resolution No: 08/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT Mr. Ravindra N Kamath (Kandivli) be and is hereby appointed as Internal Auditor/s for the year 2020-2021 after the same was proposed Mr. Ramesh U. Kamath (Chembur) & seconded by Mr. Raghunath N Naik (Dombivli)."

Agenda No. 7: Appointment of Statutory Auditors for the year 2020-2021:

M/s S. Sadashiv & Co. were appointed as Statutory Auditors for the year 2020 – 2021 after the same was proposed by Mr. Vittal D Naik (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Harischandra Kamath (Santacruz) and the Executive Committee was authorised to discuss and decide about their fee/remuneration and the following resolution was passed and adopted:

Resolution No: 09/AGM/2020:

"RESOLVED THAT M/s S. Sadashiv & Co., Chartered Accountants, be and are hereby appointed as Statutory Auditors for the year 2020 – 2021 and RESOLVED further that the Executive Committee

be and is hereby authorized to fix their fee/remuneration after the same was proposed by Mr. Vittal D Naik (Dombivli) & seconded by Mr. Harischandra Kamath (Santacruz).”

Agenda No. 9: To brief the Status of the proposal of redevelopment of Sangh's Parel building:

President, Mr. Prabhakar D Borkar, briefing on the agenda, said as under that:

- Rajapur Saraswat Sangh, Mumbai, is owning a lease property called Saraswat Sadan (earlier known as Dinshaw Terrace) at Parel, admeasuring 433.11 sq. meters, that was purchased in 1971 along with the building/premise therein (constructed in 1942) which is under open lease cess property and there are 9 tenants in the building and the Sangh is owning 3 flats;
- The building is around 78 years old and the Sangh is required to spend a huge amount towards its repair and maintenance every year and Sangh is also receiving lot of complaints from tenants about the leakage in the building;
- Considering the building is of extremely old and the increasing amount towards repair and maintenance every year, the then Executive Committee decided to explore the possibilities of going for redevelopment of the building or any other available options and an "Redevelopment Committee" consisting of 20 (including the president, Hon. Secretary & Hon. Treasurer) members was constituted in the AGM held on 22.09.2013 to look into the issue and to suggest remedies/options available in this regard;
- The "Redevelopment Committee" accordingly, after going through all the options available, vide its report, recommended for the redevelopment of the building and the Executive Committee in its meeting held on 09.07.2016, after considering the proposals from Executive Committee & "Redevelopment Committee" decided and approved the proposal of redevelopment and authorized the Executive Committee to go ahead with the "Redevelopment proposal" and further authorized to start the process of Redevelopment;
- The Executive Committee formed an "Advisory Committee" consisting of 5 members viz M/s Prabhakar D Borkar (Kalyan), Vaman S Patkar (Goregaon), Vasant R Nayak (Andheri), Ramchandra (Kumar) S. Nayak (Goregaon) & Ramesha G Nayak (Kandivli), to look into all the issues pertaining to the Redevelopment like giving public notice inviting tenders, verifying the tenders, meeting the bidders redeveloper/builders, verifying their credentials and background, selecting the redeveloper/builders, application seeking permission for the Redevelopment from the Charity Commissioner, deciding the terms and conditions of the redevelopment, drafting Development agreement etc. and recommending the same to the Executive Committee for further follow-up. Mr. Anand A Naik (Mulund) was also subsequently co-opted into the "Advisory Committee"
- The Executive committee at the advice of "Advisory Committee", initiated the due process and invited tenders vide paper advertisement Notice dated 15.07.2016 and after verifying the credentials and background of the 3 bidders, selected M/s S. P. Associates – Dadar (address) for the Redevelopment work and the AGM in its meeting held on 18.09.2016 approved the selection of M/s S. P. Associates for the Redevelopment work of the Saraswat Sadan who had offered following benefits and facilities:
 - The Developers shall allot to the Owners a premises, for an area i.e. existing usable carpet area as per MHADA measurement plus 35% (thirty five per cent) on the existing carpet usable area;

- In addition to the above, the Developers shall also allot to the Owners premises of an area of 1500 (one thousand five hundred) square feet carpet usable area;
 - The Developers shall also require to pay, a sum of Rs.1100/- (Rupees one thousand one hundred only) per square feet on existing usable carpet area of the building as Corpus fund, to the Owners at the time of handing over possession of the premises referred in clause (ii) above;
 - The Developers shall be required to pay to the Owners "Monetary Compensation" of Rs.30.00 Lakhs (Rupees thirty lakhs only);
 - The Developers shall be required to pay to the Owners an amount of Rs. 30.00 lakhs (Rupees thirty lakhs only) as refundable "Security Deposit" at the time of vacating and handing over the existing premises by the Owners to the Developers;
 - The Developers shall require to give Bank Guarantee of Rs.1.20 crores (one crore twenty lakhs only) to the Owners for due performance of the Development work;
 - The Developers shall pay/reimburse to the Owners displacement compensation calculated @ Rs.100/- (one hundred only) per sq. ft. per month for their temporary alternate accommodation, during the period of reconstruction; &
 - The Developers shall complete the development work within a period of 36 (thirty-six) months from the date of Commencement Certificate or demolition of the existing building whichever is later.
- Based on the understanding between the Sangh and the Redeveloper (M/s S. P. Associates), Sangh applied for permission for the redevelopment of the Sangh's Parel premise to the office of the Charity commissioner and the Charity Commissioner vide his order dated 15.07.2017 had granted the permission for redevelopment with the condition that the redevelopment deed shall be executed within a period of three years from the date of this order.
 - Based on these understanding between the Sangh and the Redeveloper & Charity Commissioner's order, the negotiations to obtain consent from the tenants started and because of their initial adamant attitude Sangh /redeveloper could not obtain their consent in time and the issue remained pending because of the covid-19 pandemic and lock-down situations. However, due to continuous follow-up and protracted negotiations with the tenants, Sangh /redeveloper could obtain the consents of 8 tenants for the redevelopment (one consent was not taken as a suit filed by Mr. Benjamin P. Patoley (RAD/1195/2017) is sub-judice) only in the month of September 2020.
 - In view of delay in obtaining the consent from tenants, the redevelopment deed could not be executed within a period of three years from the date of the order of the Charity Commissioner, an application seeking extension of the time limit to execute the redevelopment deed was made which is pending before the office of the Charity Commissioner and will be heard on September 30, 2021. A separate application seeking some modifications in the order of the Charity Commissioner dated 15.07.2017 was also made along with this application which also will be heard on September 30, 2021 along with other application.

- Once the order from the office of the Charity Commissioner is received, the Development Agreement will be signed between Sangh and the Redeveloper and further process of Redevelopment will start with 1. Adjudication process 2. MHADA office till NOC is received & 3. BMC office till the receipt of IOD from its office & demolitions of the building for redevelopment purpose. Before the demolition of the building individual agreements with tenants and the Sangh will be entered by the redeveloper mentioning all terms and conditions of the redevelopment till the possession of the allotted/purchased flats.
- The proposed building, subject to approval of plan /lay out from BMC, shall be of 21 – storey building with modern amenities like swimming pool, free parking for all the tenants including Sangh, 2 refuge areas, society office etc.
- President further briefed that because of some technical problems the 'property title' was not transferred in the name of the Sangh by BMC and the Sangh had to pay heavy premium and penalty to rectify this error and now the 'property title' has been transferred to Sangh's name i.e. Rajapura Saraswata Sangha. President further said that the corrected property card has also been obtained by BMC Estate Department in the name of the Sangh
- Once the new building is constructed and completed in every aspect, the possessions of the flats will be handed over to Sangh & all the tenants and a housing society will be formed by transferring the tenancy rights to the newly formed housing society.
- President thanked all the members of the "Advisory Committee" Vaman S Patkar - Goregaon, Vasant R Nayak (Andheri), Ramchandra (Kumar) S. Nayak (Goregaon), Ramesha G Nayak (Kandivli) & Anand A Naik (Mulund) for their continuous efforts towards redevelopment project work and further said that these members work till the completion of the project consisting of a new very beautiful premium building and appealed members to book a flat in this building if they so desire.

Mr. Vasudev Nayak (Dombivli) asked whether Sangh will be able to get additional rooms/flats legally as all the rooms/flats are on "Pagdi System". He further asked what if the redeveloper does not complete the flat within stipulated time i.e 3 years – President, while replying clarified that they Sangh has received the permissions from the Charity Commissioners office for the redevelopment of the building and expect the receipt of the approval from BMC/MHADA in this regard. Further President also clarified that a clause has been incorporated in the Development Agreement imposing penalty to the redeveloper if the building is not completed within the stipulated time.

As there were no further clarifications or explanation sought by the members regarding the presentation of "Status of the Redevelopment" explained herein above, the Status Report presented by the president was accepted and approved.

Agenda No. 10: To adopt & approve the proposed amendment to the bye laws: President Mr. P D Borkar speaking on the agenda said that in view of the Sangh's widening the activities further and also because of need to make some required corrections/changes in the existing bye-laws, the Executive Committee has decided to propose the following amendments to the existing bye laws. He said that the required notice in this regard is given along with the copies of the proposed amendments which are as under: -

President read each and every proposed changes and explained the reasons for seeking amendments. After this, the following suggestions were received:

- Mr. Anand Naik (Mulund) suggested that provisions should be made to hold all the meetings virtually for which President replied that provision of virtual meetings for monthly meetings has been made in clause No. 20 – a.
- Mr. Diwakar D Naik (Chembur) suggested that Life Membership for Class A may be Rs. 5,000/- instead of Rs. 3,000/- (Clause 8-a: Class of Membership) which was not accepted by members present and it was suggested by all that the proposal of Rs. 3,000/- may be retained as it is. Mr Diwakar further asked that whether the existing members need to pay the differential amount after amendment, president said the new subscription charges will be applicable only after the approval from the office of the Charity Commissioner is received and the existing members need not pay the differential amount even after amendment is approved.
- Mr. Ashok Kamath (Kandivli) suggested that in (Clause No. 4: Collection of Funds) provision may be made for acceptance of donations from foreign countries / NRIs. After discussion. It was decided to accept this suggestion unanimously and to make necessary changes in the proposed amendments presented today.
- Mr. Ravindra Nayak (Dombivli) suggested that provisions be made to run hospitals /clinics for the benefit of members as an objective. After discussion it was decided to add this suggestion under 'objectives to be added'.
- Mr. M P Naik suggested that – 1. The name of the Sangh should be replaced with some other more attractive name denoting that Sangh is doing multi-beneficial activities which was not accepted saying that the Sangh should not change the name. 2. Clause of merger/demerger/ acquisition shall be added. President said that suggestion of acquisitions of other charitable trusts may be looked into and considered by the Annual General Meeting at appropriate time and decided accordingly and no need to incorporate the same in the bye laws. It was decided to incorporate this suggestion in the amendment accordingly. 3. Suggested to incorporate suitable changes for disposal of assets of the Sangh which was, after discussions, not accepted 4. Donations to other organisations – President said that the Statutory auditor has said that Charitable trusts cannot donate money to another charitable trust as the money collected shall be used as per their directions and suggestions. 5. Incorporation of modern IT Apps for easier functioning and co-ordination of all activities of the Sangh: decided to look into at an appropriate time

Agenda No. 10: consideration of letters, if any, and to take appropriate decision: President informed that the Sangh has not received any letter/s from members to place before the AGM. President said that Mr. L V Nayak, President of Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Mandal – Dombivli was to attend today's meeting but could not attend because of some personal reasons

and has sent WhatsApp message wishing the AGM all the best and success. Through this message he on behalf of Mandal had expressed his happiness with the decision of the Sangh to hold its AGM in Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Mandal Bhavan and requested the Sangh to hold all its future activities / functions in the Sabha Bhavan of the Mandal which encourages further unity amongst the Associations. His message was read for the information of the members.

Agenda No. 11 / Agenda No. 12: Any other matter with the permission of the chair / members' speech:

Madhav V. Prabhu (Borivli):

Spoke about the establishment & activities of Shree Durga Parameshwari Credit Co-operative Society Ltd, Parel under the banner of Rajapur Saraswat Sangh. Informed about their plan to open its branch at Dombivli and sought co-operation & support from the members, particularly staying in Dombivli. He requested the younger generation to come forward in the activities of the Sangha Samsthas so that these samsthas run smoothly without any interruption in future too. Thanked Sangha & President for giving an opportunity to talk about the Society.

Raghunath Prabhu (Dombivli):

Thanked Sangh for holding AGM in the Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Bhavan and hoped that in future also Sangh will hold all its programmes /functions at this Seva Mandal only and requested the committee members to do so. He appreciated the way the President Mr Borkar presented and explained the Status of the Redevelopment of the Sangh and Amendments to the Bye Laws point-to-point continuously without any break. Congratulated the newly elected committee members and wished them all the best and suggested that Sangh should celebrate its 75th year celebration in a grand manner and that too in its newly constructed/redeveloped building. Suggested that since Vighnarthartha Shree Mahaganapathi Seva Mandal, Mumbai and Sangh are organizing/celebrating most of their functions together, Vighnarthartha Shree Mahaganapathi Seva Mandal should merge with the Sangh and in future they should conduct all their functions together and also purchase a plot and construct a hall/auditorium for the benefits of the members staying in the western side. He also said that this was the wish of late Shri Gopalkrishna Navelkar, Borivli. He appealed to the Sangh to start educational institutions for the benefits of the members of the samaj.

Sanjay Patkar (Mulund):

Congratulated the newly elected committee members and wished them all the best and hoped that the new committee will work towards the betterment of the samaj /society and will come out with more and more samaj-beneficial programmes. Expressed his and Mandal's happiness over the Sanghs decision to hold AGM in its hall and requested to continue the same in future too. Suggested that the Sangh can retain one flat /room at its Parel premise and think off to purchase a plot in the western region so that the members of the samaj will get maximum benefit. Said that all sangh samsthas should stay complimentary to each other not as competitive. Requested youngsters to come forward voluntarily and work towards the progress of the samaj. Suggested that the Amrit Mahotsav of the Sangh should be held in a very grand manner and wished all the best to the Sangha.

Ravindra Nayak (Dombivli):

Said that the name of the Sangh may be retained as Rajapur Saraswat Sangh only and no need to change it further. Suggested to retain one flat in the new building for Sangh's use and sell the remaining flats and buy a plot in MMRDA region to construct Hall or Educational institutions for the benefits of the samaj members. Called upon the next generation to take more interest in the activities of the samsthas of samaj and continue the same spirit as that of present senior active members.

Ramchandra Nayak (Goregaon):

Thanked the members for electing him to the Executive Committee for another two years and assured that he will work continuously for the Redevelopment project and said that as per the present plan, if approved by BMC, a beautiful premium building will come up with swimming pool and other modern facilities. He said that because of prevailing Covid-19 and lock-down conditions the Redevelopment-Project-related-work could not be completed as per the planned expectations.

Mr Ramanna Shevde (Kandivli):

He expressed great concern over the less attendance of members in the AGM and suggested that fine shall be imposed to the absentee members and this may force the members to attend the AGM. Wished all the best to the newly elected committee members.

P.R.Ravishankar (Dahanu):

He expressed that its very nice to see and meet so many members today after 2 years as they could not meet each other due to present prevailing conditions. He viewed that Sangha's name shall be kept as Rajapur Saraswat Sangh only and no change should be done as it has some sentimental value. In his view, imposing fine to the members for not attending the AGMs is not the solution, instead, he said, more and more programmes shall be arranged to attract the attendance of the members. Appreciated and praised the manner of handling of Mr. P D Borkar as a President of the Sangh and lauded his efforts during his long association with the Sangh. He hoped that a beautiful new building will come up at the earliest and appreciated the efforts taken by the President and Advisory Committee in this regard. Opined that every good work done by the Sangh shall be given wide publicity in newspaper /media so that the other members from the other community will also come to know about the work of our samaj. Informed that Mr. Rajan Bandelkar has become All India President of NAREDCO (National Real Estate Development Council and our samaj should be proud that a person from our community is occupying such a senior position. He congratulated the newly elected committee members and wished them all then best. He assured that he will always be available for any samaj work.

President's Speech:

Thanked all the office bearers, committee members of the Shree Varad Siddhi Vinayak Seva Mandal for allowing the Sangh to hold its AGM free of cost. He said that all the suggestions given by the members in this AGM will be looked into and needful action will be taken wherever it is possible. The President announced requirement of medical assistance to Mr. Jayprakash Prabhu, (Borivali) and requested the members to extend maximum possible financial benefit to him as he is in need of money towards the treatment. The President also announced that the SLF is looking

out for the dedicated volunteers in different areas to help SLF for conducting/organizing various samaj-beneficial programmes and asked the interested members to contact him. He called upon the members to extend their full support to Shree Durga Parameshwari Credit Co-operative Society Ltd in their new venture of opening a branch at Dombivli. He said that he supports the idea of merger of any other charitable trusts in the best interest of the Sangh and said that Sangh always supported the unity amongst the samaj members and further said that Sangh has dropped some of the activities as they are being conducted by other associations. He suggested that all the Samsthas in Maharashtra should come together and work out common programmes to save the money.
